## **Ecological Footprint**

The area of land and water needed to sustain a person or population (including home, places of work and play, materials needed to build and maintain these places, vehicles and transportation systems, food, waste treatment, etc.)

#### Some criticisms

- focuses only environment
- ignores multiple land uses
- downplays population issues
- > Widely used
