- What is Gender?
  - Social/culture construction
  - Power, autonomy, rationality, public masculine
  - Weakness, dependence, emotionality, private feminine
  - Masculinity and femininity are relational
  - Gender characteristics are generally unequal: positive value ascribed to masculine characteristics

- \* Feminist questions for IR
  - Where are the women in positions of political or military leadership?
  - \* How are the types of power necessary to keep unequal gender structures in place perpetuated?
  - Does it make any difference to states' policy practices that their foreign and security policies are often legitimated through appeals to various types of masculinity?

## Gender and Security

- Myth of protection
- Strong connection between masculinity and war
  - Focus on physical capabilities or threat thereof
- \* Feminist approach
  - Diminution of all forms of violence
  - Bottom-up

# Gender and Economy

- Women disproportionately at the bottom of the socio-economic scale
- Much work not considered 'gainful employment'
  - Housewife versus breadwinner
- Pushed into lower paid occupations
- Corporations take advantage of subservient gender role to lower wages
